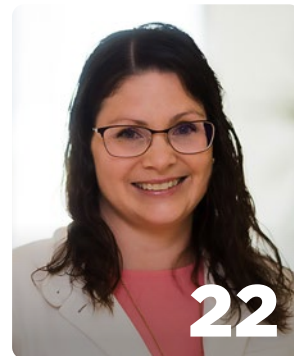

Taryn is a graduate of the University of Saskatchewan's Edwards School of Business where she majored in accounting. She went on to earn her Chartered Professional Accountant designation through the legacy CMA body in 2010.

Taryn's experience began at the Canada Revenue Agency where she was a GST and Income Tax Auditor. She worked at SaskEnergy from 2013 to 2022, primarily in Rates, before joining CPA Saskatchewan as Director, Member Services on January 3, 2023. In addition to her previous roles, she served as a sessional lecturer through Saskatchewan Polytechnic's Centre of Continuing Education from 2012 to 2024.

As Director, Member Services, Taryn has represented CPA Saskatchewan on numerous regional and national committees. She also oversaw key areas such as professional development, recruitment, practical experience, events, and communications at CPA Saskatchewan.

Under Taryn's leadership, CPA Saskatchewan's member services expanded significantly, enhancing support for members and strengthening the profession in Saskatchewan. She introduced PD Connect in 2024, centralizing all of CPA Saskatchewan's professional development in one system.

CPA SASKATCHEWAN BOARD UPDATE

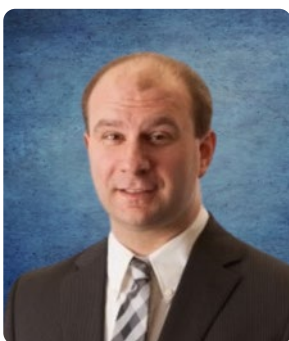

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2026 MEMBER RECOGNITION AWARD RECIPIENTS

CPA Saskatchewan recognizes excellence in our profession through Member Recognition Awards. We are proud to present CPA Saskatchewan's four award recipients for 2026, including CPA Saskatchewan's first Honorary CPA. We will honour this year's recipients at our Annual Member Recognition Awards Gala taking place September 18, 2026, at the Hotel Saskatchewan in Regina, SK.

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT

The Lifetime Achievement Award (LAA) is awarded to an FCPA with 20 or more consecutive years of service who has demonstrated leadership in the profession by supporting the CPA Saskatchewan Mission and Vision throughout their career.



Bruce Willis, FCPA, FCA

Bruce is a recently retired Partner with KPMG LLP who has built an exceptional career in public practice and advisory leadership. Since joining KPMG LLP in 2001, he held increasingly senior leadership roles, including Office Managing Partner for Regina and Advisory Business Unit Leader for KPMG's Western Canadian region. In these roles, Bruce provided strategic oversight across nine offices in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, and British Columbia, while championing growth in audit, tax, and advisory services and supporting the development of professionals across the firm. His influence extended nationally through his participation on KPMG's National Advisory Leadership Team, where he contributed to firm-wide strategic planning and guided the organization through periods of significant professional change and served as the national service line leader for Governance, Risk and Compliance Services for eight years prior to his most recent roles.

A defining hallmark of Bruce's career has been his commitment to mentorship and talent development. He has personally mentored numerous CPAs and professionals, many of whom have gone on to become partners and leaders within the profession. Bruce consistently encouraged others to pursue leadership roles, professional service, and community involvement, leaving a legacy that extends well beyond his own accomplishments.

Throughout the course of his career, Bruce has also contributed extensively to the CPA profession through his service with the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Saskatchewan (ICAS), including serving on ICAS Council from 2005 to 2006. In addition, Bruce contributed to several ICAS committees, including the Education Committee, Fees Review Committee, Professional Development Committee, Professional Conduct Committee, and Practice Appraisal Committee. Bruce was awarded his Fellow Chartered Accountant designation in 2006.

Bruce's commitment to leadership extends well beyond the profession. USE OF THE CPA DESIGNATION IN SASKATCHEWAN:

A REFRESHER

As specified in *The Accounting Profession Act* (The Act) and CPA Saskatchewan Bylaws, the terms “Chartered Professional Accountant,” “professional accountant” and “CPA” may only be used by current and registered members and firms. Limitation of the use of these terms allows the public, including employers, to be informed that only those displaying the designation, title or initials are registered professionals with the requisite knowledge, skill, and competency required for membership, that they are bound by a professional code of conduct, are required to maintain competency through continuing professional development, and are held accountable through a regulatory process.

Candidates, students, former members, former firms, non-registered firms, suspended members, suspended firms, individuals who are not members including individuals with international accounting designations or certifications are not entitled to use any designation in a manner that implies they are a member or firm of CPA Saskatchewan.

What qualifies as “use”?

“Use” is to be interpreted broadly. As outlined in [sections 22\(1\) to 22\(4\) of The Act](#), it includes, but is not limited to, using the terms “Chartered Professional Accountant,” “CPA,” “Professional Accountant,” “Accredited Public Accountant,” “Certified Public Accountant,” “Registered Industrial Accountant” or the initials “AAPA,” “ACA,” “APA,” “FAPA” or “RIA” to imply that the person is a member or that the firm is registered. Also included under this definition of “use” is using the equivalent of CPA in another language. In Saskatchewan, any of these forms of use are protected

in the Act to registered CPA Saskatchewan members and firms, who must use the titles in accordance with The Act, CPA Saskatchewan’s Bylaws, and other guidance. Any other designation, title, initials or description, abbreviated or otherwise, cannot be used to imply that a person is a member or firm when they are not registered.

The public directory

As part of its regulatory responsibility to protect the public, CPA Saskatchewan maintains current online directories of [members](#) and [registered firms](#). The public, including potential or current clients and employers, can easily verify an individual or firm’s registration with CPA Saskatchewan, supporting they are accountable through a regulatory process. These directories also enable the public to verify a member or firm’s status and whether an individual and/or firm is appropriately registered and licensed, where applicable, for the services offered.

Additionally, the Chartered Professional Accountants Western School of Business maintains a public [directory](#) of all candidates currently enrolled.

Membership and use of the designation with other bodies

Granting the use of the CPA designation remains provincially regulated within Saskatchewan and any other province or territory. Effective April 1, 2026, CPA Saskatchewan members are no longer members of CPA Canada and instead have the option to obtain a voluntary

membership directly through CPA Canada. It is important to note that CPA Canada continues to not have any authority to grant the use of the designation as it does not have a regulatory role in Saskatchewan or in any other province or territory. For clarity, **membership with CPA Canada does not grant an individual the right to use the CPA designation in Saskatchewan or elsewhere.**

Additionally, as the accounting profession is provincially regulated, being registered as a CPA in another province or jurisdiction does not grant an individual the right to use the CPA designation in Saskatchewan; *in short, you may only use the CPA designation in Saskatchewan if you are registered as a member of CPA Saskatchewan.* Members of CPA Saskatchewan are permitted to include a designation from another jurisdiction as long as they do so in compliance with the issuing body's governing authority and The Act. The Saskatchewan CPA designation should appear first, followed by the other jurisdiction's designation accompanied by the name of the jurisdiction where regulated—for example: "Jane Doe, CPA, CPA (Bermuda)," "John Doe, CPA, CPA (Illinois)," and "Jane Doe, CPA, CPA (Alberta)."

Similarly, being a member of CPA Saskatchewan does not grant an individual the right to use the CPA designation in other jurisdictions. CPA Saskatchewan members must abide by the applicable laws of other jurisdictions, as per rule 213 of the CPA Saskatchewan Code of Professional Conduct.

Legacy designations

The Act also restricts the use of legacy designations ("Chartered Accountant", "Certified Management Accountant" or "Certified General Accountant" or the initials "CA", "CMA", or "CGA") to CPA Saskatchewan members only, when used in conjunction with the designation "Chartered Professional Accountant or "CPA". Since the 10th anniversary of CPA Saskatchewan's proclamation on November 10, 2024, CPA Saskatchewan members in good standing with legacy designations have had the option to use only their CPA designation or to continue to tag both their CPA and legacy designation(s) after their name. For example: "Jane Doe, CPA, CGA," and "Jane Doe, CPA," are both acceptable for a member.

Upon logging into the Member Portal following November 10, 2024, members were prompted to update their tagging preferences. Further changes to a member's tagging preferences must be made by contacting the CPA Saskatchewan office.

CPA candidates

CPA candidates are **not permitted** to use the CPA designation and must be careful not to present their status in a manner that implies they are a member of CPA Saskatchewan. Candidates may indicate that they

are a candidate or enrolled in the relevant program. See examples below:

Permitted: "Jane Doe, enrolled as a candidate of CPA Saskatchewan."

Not permitted: "Jane Doe, CPA Candidate."

Individuals who are not members with other accounting designations

The completion of an international accounting body's certification program does not ensure that the individual is subject to regulations that are consistent with Saskatchewan's regulatory standards. Therefore, **any individual holding an international accounting designation who is not a member of CPA Saskatchewan is not permitted to display that international designation after their name** to signify membership with a professional accounting organization while working in Saskatchewan, regardless of whether the jurisdiction is displayed. The individual may only refer to their accounting credentials in the body of their resumé or in their biography on a firm or company website, provided that any such reference is factually correct.

We are aware that some organizations are listing the names and international designations of international designated staff in their firm or company directories. **Please note it is only appropriate to list international designations for staff members who are also members of CPA Saskatchewan, and the disclosure of these designations must comply with the requirements noted above.**

Not permitted: John Doe, ACCA

Permitted: John Doe completed the ACCA program in 2018

Examples of permitted and prohibited CPA designation use:

Permitted if applicable:

Jane Doe, CPA

John Doe, CPA, CGA

Jane Doe, CPA, CPA (Illinois)

Not permitted:

John Doe, CMA – legacy designation cannot be used alone

Jane Doe, CPA (Illinois) – other jurisdiction title cannot be used alone in Saskatchewan

John Doe, CPA, CPA (USA) – the CPA designation in the USA is regulated by state boards; therefore, the applicable state is the correct jurisdiction to display.

Jane Doe, CPA Candidate – Candidates/students are not entitled to use the CPA designation

John Doe, CPA (Canada) –the CPA designation in Canada is regulated by provincial CPA bodies

Jane Doe Smith, CA (New Zealand)

John Doe, CPA (Alberta)

Jane Doe, ACCA (UK)

John Doe, ACCA

Use of Fellow Title

Members may only use the fellow title, designated by “F” in front of the designation or legacy designation of the Institute that conferred the title upon them. For example:

- Member Name, FCPA, FCMA
- Member Name, FCPA, FCA
- Member Name, FCPA, FCGA

What happens if someone misuses the CPA designation?

Depending on the circumstances, CPA Saskatchewan will take appropriate action to protect the public and the reputation of the profession in cases where an individual is

implying they are a member or has a firm registration. This may include informing the person of the legal provisions in the Act and requesting an immediate correction, issuing a cease-and-desist letter, and/or seeking a court injunction. Violating the restricted use of the CPA designation is also an offence under The Act punishable by a \$5,000 fine on first offense (up to \$20,000) and/or six months of imprisonment.

Cases of unauthorized use of the designation should be brought to CPA Saskatchewan's attention. Please email CPASK at registrar@cpask.ca so that appropriate action can be taken. Legislation provides for the protection of the CPA designation, and we rely on members and firms to be vigilant regarding its use.

IMPROVING FINANCIAL REPORTING IN FIRST NATIONS: CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

In 2021, during the pandemic, the First Nations Financial Management Board (the FMB) began noting a decline in the availability of audited annual financial statements among First Nations across Canada. In 2023, the FMB, through its Statistical Initiative, undertook a study to better understand the root causes of this trend. The findings confirmed declining availability, and preliminary evidence suggested some potential causes including a shortage of experienced Chartered Professional Accountants to support day-to-day financial management. There were also indications of limited availability of financial statement audit services in some more remote regions of the country.

Recognizing the importance of this issue and potential impacts on First Nation governance, the FMB partnered with the First Nations Financial Authority (the FNFA) to establish a task force. Together, they conducted an in-depth, broad-based research study into the causes of missing and late-audited financial statements. The research project entailed a cross-country survey of First Nation governments, asking 24 questions related to their accounting and administration, to which 125 sets of responses were received. The research also incorporated insights from practicing CPAs in partnership with several CPA governing bodies, including CPA Saskatchewan. The findings reinforced the initial observations and resulted in the development of 21 recommendations to address the accounting and audit resource gap in First Nations.

These recommendations are intended to support First Nations in strengthening their financial capacity and systems, addressing identified challenges, and drive meaningful, lasting change. They are organized around three key priorities:

- Capacity-building initiatives: expanding training programs tailored to First Nations governance, administration, and accounting practices; developing a pipeline of uniquely qualified Indigenous CPAs; and expanding on-demand professional support services.
- Institution-building: together with our partners, developing institutions to respond to the immediate and evolving needs of First Nations governments.

- Policy advocacy: advocating for changes to funding structures and regulatory frameworks that better reflect the realities and priorities of First Nations.

The recommendations build on the FMB's relationships with key partners including Indigenous Services Canada, CPA governing bodies and the Assembly of First Nations. It was also important that there was alignment with the FMB's mandate and ongoing operations and goals. This includes drawing on the experience of its staff and partners and continuing to deliver programs that respond to the needs and priorities identified by the First Nations served by FMB.

The FMB focuses on promoting good governance and finance practices to support First Nations in acquiring and managing their financial resources in a manner that supports the comprehensive development of their own goals and objectives. Through its financial management, capacity development, and certification services—offered at no cost to First Nations—the FMB's suite of programs has made a positive contribution to improving First Nation operations. These improvements have, in turn, supported stronger financial and broader socio-economic outcomes for their members.

The FMB is committed to supporting First Nation economic self-determination, including by promoting strong, transparent, and accountable financial systems. In response to observed challenges, the FMB worked with its partners—including the FNFA and the communities it serves—to better understand the underlying causes and identify practical solutions. This has involved building on its existing strengths while continuing to evolve its programs and services to reflect the changing priorities and needs of First Nations.

MORE PEOPLE IN CANADA ARE USING AI AS A MENTAL HEALTH CARE TOOL, BUT ARE WE READY FOR IT?

RESPONSIBLE INNOVATION IS CRITICAL WHEN IT COMES TO AI AND MENTAL HEALTH

AI tools are all the rage right now. AI can help us automate simple tasks, summarize complex information, and get our creative juices flowing. But AI is also controversial. From possible job impacts and flawed knowledge to ethical use and the decline of critical thinking, AI, like many things, comes with risks and benefits.

While we can use AI to help us manage our personal and work lives more efficiently, AI can also provide incorrect or misleading information (even going so far as to make it up at times). And because AI is built on human information, it also comes with bias and perpetuates existing discrimination and stigma.

USE OF AI FOR MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT IS ON THE RISE

In a recent survey by Mental Health Research Canada, almost 10 percent of people in Canada said they intentionally used AI tools to get advice or support for their mental health¹. Given so many mental healthcare services in Canada aren't funded through our public healthcare system, it's no surprise more people are turning to AI for help.

Without access to services, and faced with long waitlists and high costs, people using AI for mental health support may not have any other options.

When it comes to mental health, AI can help break down barriers to information. For example, AI can help people understand and express their emotions. But for people with ongoing mental health concerns including mental illnesses and substance use health challenges, AI may be creating more harm than good.

CHATBOTS AREN'T THERAPISTS

AI chatbots may be great for brainstorming and idle chatter, but generative AI chatbots aren't a substitute for qualified mental health services. In fact, for people experiencing a mental health crisis or mental illness, chatbots can cause more harm than good.

First, because AI comes with the same biases that exist in society, it can reinforce racist and misogynistic attitudes for equity seeking users. A study by researchers at Brown University found that AI chatbots routinely violated core mental health ethical standards including unfair discrimination based on gender, culture, and religion².

AI also responds differently to different mental health concerns. Researchers at Stanford University provided

various AI models with descriptions of people with different mental illnesses. They found that AI showed increased stigma toward people described as having a substance use disorder and a severe or persistent mental illness. For example, all but one of the AI models they tested responded that they wouldn't be willing to work closely with a person struggling with alcohol dependence or someone with schizophrenia. And just as stigma does in the real world, the stigma of AI can stop people from getting the help they need.

Another emerging concern is AI psychosis³. Some AI chatbots have been found to amplify or validate harmful and/or delusional thinking. Because generative-AI mirrors the user's words and tone, it creates a sort of echo chamber. Chatbots may reinforce difficult feelings in their responses back to users, even drawing from previous conversations which can further amplify harmful thinking.

These traps have real-world consequences⁴ with stories of AI chatbots discouraging people from seeking support and providing harmful advice⁵ and information with sometimes deadly consequences⁶. Chatbots aren't designed to challenge harmful thoughts and may not recognize the connection between thoughts and requests for information that a human would recognize as suicidal ideation.

HOW TO STAY SAFE USING AI

If you've ever searched for a mental health app, you likely got a long list without any clarity on who made them and how. With so many options, it's hard to figure out which apps were created using psychological research with clinical testing, and which weren't. Government has a role to play in the regulation, oversight, and ethical standards of AI, but you have control too. Here are some tips for using AI safely for mental health support.

1. Seek help from professionals whenever possible. AI is not a substitute for qualified mental health support from trained individuals. Mental health support is often available online, by phone, or in person. In a crisis, people across Canada can connect to a real person anytime, day or night, by dialing or texting 988. For other kinds of support, look for a community-based mental health care provider. [Find your nearest CMHA.](#)

2. Do your research. Before using an app for mental health support, look into who made it and how, and whether it's been tested. Look for AI tools developed with and by qualified mental health professionals. Also look to see if it's been tested in clinical settings with published results from peer-reviewed journals.

3. Check your privacy. While your conversation with a chatbot may feel private, it can be collected and stored on a server. Check if the app you're using has privacy protocols in place. You'll want to use a tool that secures your personal information in a dedicated environment with strict access controls.

4. Limit what you share with AI. Avoid sharing sensitive information or information that would reveal your identity. When using AI, you can change personal details like your name and location to protect your identity. And, if the AI tool you're using lets you delete your chat history, do so.

5. Factcheck the info AI provides. Don't assume everything AI says is accurate, true, and real. Critically consider information provided by AI. You can ask AI to provide references for any information it provides. Then make sure that reference is real and accurate by checking the source. Look for peer-reviewed journal articles and web content from qualified organizations like CMHA, the Canadian or American Psychological Association, government health ministries, and respected institutions (hospitals and universities).
